At a glance...

Our greatest wish is that this year we should be lucky enough to join the Rebbe's Yud Shvat Farbrengen in the 3rd Ba'is Hamikdosh, and celebrate the Ikar Shechina coming back home to this world!
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What happened on this day?

1) Rebbetzin Rivkah's Yartzeit

Rebbetzin Rivkah was the Friediker Rebbe's grandmother, wife of the Rebbe Maharash. The Friediker Rebbe heard many, many stories from her, and wrote down many of them. In honor of her Yartzeit, for Yud Shvat 5710 (the day the Friediker Rebbe himself was to be nistalek), the Friediker Rebbe edited and prepared a Maamar to be given out and learned. It was called Basi Legani, and as you all know – become very famous and central in our lives as chassidim of Dor Hashvii.

2) Yud Shvat 5710 (Tof Shin Yud) - Histalkus of the Friediker Rebbe, on Shabbos morning.

As mentioned above, the Friediker Rebbe had edited and prepared a Maamar to be learned on that Shabbos. It was called Basi Legani, based on a possuk in Shir Hashirim. When the Friediker Rebbe was nistalek (passed on), the chassidim named this Maamar as the Maamar of the Histalkus.



3) Yud Shvat 5711 (Tof Shin Yud Alef) - The Rebbe agrees officially to take on the Nesius - to be the Rebbe!



This was marked by the Rebbe saying a Maamar for the chassidim. During the whole year, the Rebbe farbrenged about being mekusher (connecting) to the Friediker Rebbe, but did not say his own Maamar. On the night following Yud Shvat (*already Yud Alef Shvat – the Rebbe explains the significance of that in a special sicha...*) – the Rebbe came down to farbreng, and during that farbrengen, said a Maamar called Basi Lagani, explaining the first section of the Friediker Rebbe's Maamar Basi Legani.

The chassidim were ecstatic that we have a Rebbe!

4) Every year, Yud Shvat is marked by the Rebbe and Chysidim as a day of major importance and celebration.

The Rebbe holds a large farbrengen the evening between 10 and 11 Shvat, saying a new Maamar Basi Legani every year (until 5748).
